Casey Field

The Phase I Site Plan process has been held up by a new complication: the State Highway Administration wants part of the property for a storm water management for the ICC. Toll Brothers will have to reconfigure some lots, relocate the MPDU units, and may add more multi-family homes to the plan in order to make up lost lots. The revised site plan is expected soon, and could require major review if changes from the approved are material.

The condemnation proceedings have become further complicated by a change in legal counsel for M-NCPPC. This has also affected drafting of a Management Agreement incorporating land use restrictions and maintenance parameters intended to give M-NCPPC and the Town certain responsibilities for the field. The property owner wants the Phase One Site Plan approved before the condemnation is settled. Stay tuned...

Deer Park Bridge

The Town and Gaithersburg were finally provided DPWT's cost estimates for rehabilitation or bridge replacement. Mayor Compton and the core Deer Park Bridge Committee will review the information provided by the County. It is problematic whether Gaithersburg will agree to take ownership and responsibility for bridge maintenance due to liability and cost concerns and uncertainties.

Ride-On Bus Stop Improvements Coming

The County is planning to add waiting pads and benches to five of the six pair of stops along the borders of the Town. Four stop locations will be slightly shifted to provide safer, drier, better access for bus riders: the stop near the Asplundh Co. on Railroad Street, the pair at Grove Rd. and Railroad Street, the stop at Center St. and the stop at #515 Washington Grove Lane. #### NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Washington Grove Town Council will hold a public hearing on Monday, May 22, 2006, 7:30 p.m., in McCathran Hall, 300 Grove Avenue, Washington Grove, Maryland. This 2nd public hearing is to take public comment regarding Zoning Text Amendment 2005-07, which has been revised by the Town Council. The proposed amendment will clarify fence requirements (including deer fencing), create a new temporary use permit requirement for portable containers (PODS) and construction dumpsters, place expiration limits on building permits, and add two new definitions (accessory building & primary residence) to the ordinances.

Building Permits

If you are going to erect a building or structure (including fences), make structural alterations to, or move any existing building or other structure, you must first obtain a building permit from the Washington Grove Planning Commission. The Town zoning ordinance governs setbacks, lot coverage and height. Applications are available at the Town Office at 301-926-2256. The permit fee is \$10.00, payable to the Town of Washington Grove. Interior renovations, which involve electrical, plumbing, or load-bearing changes, generally require a County permit. A shed requires a County permit as well. The Town must first sign off all applications for County-required building permits. The Historic Preservation Commission will review most permits as well.

Goose Nooze

In our efforts to prevent a repeat of the unsavory beach conditions of two years ago, when the geese raised goslings, we have obtained a federal permit to treat the eggs so that they will not develop. Please do not

harass the geese now sitting on and defending the nest, or take the eggs. We have access to new eggs now, but if the geese abandon this nest and build another, we may not be able to find or reach it. If eggs are removed, the female will lay more, and stay longer in the area. When no goslings hatch, we expect the geese to abandon the nest and leave (within 4 weeks). Please do not take your dog to the lake if it chases geese, for the same reasons. And, please don't feed the geese or ducks. Thanks! A. Phillips
